There are more than 10,000 Cambridge schools in over 160 countries worldwide. Results of Cambridge schools are evaluated according to three different basic categories (gold, silver and bronze) in terms of the total marks reached.

BRONZ

0-39% of total marks

Working towards the standard.

Learners have a **basic** grasp of the curriculum content.

They have achieved a **few** of the learning objectives and are working toward achieving others.

They would benefit from **more focus** on some areas of the curriculum.

SILVER

40-79% of total marks

Meeting the standard.

Learners have a **sound** grasp of the curriculum content.

They are successfully achieving **many** of the learning objectives as expected at this stage.

GOLD

80-100% of total marks

Exceeding the standard.

Learners have an **excellent** grasp of the curriculum content.

They are successfully achieving **the great majority** of the learning objectives what is expected at this stage.

Percentage ranges that students need to reach in order to achieve the Gold, Silver or Bronze grades are different at each stage (Grades in ISB) and subject. These percentage ranges are shown below in separate table for the lower and upper Grades.
