



## **Understanding the IGCSE**

#### What is the IGCSE?

The **International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE)** is an internationally recognized qualification for students in **Grades 9 and 10**. It's designed to build a solid academic foundation and prepare students for the next stage of their education, such as the **IB Diploma Program (IBDP)** (offered by ISB), A Levels, or other post-16 studies.

# Why is it important?

Even though our school follows the **IB curriculum in Grades 11 and 12**, the IGCSE can still play an important role for some students:

- **For admissions:** we may accept students into our **Grades 11 and 12 IB courses** based on their IGCSE results, as these show academic readiness and subject knowledge.
- **For universities:** some universities, especially in the UK and Commonwealth countries, may ask to see IGCSE (or equivalent) results, particularly in **English** and **Mathematics**.

# **Core subjects**

All exams are taken at the end of Grade 10 (April-May).

At our school, all IGCSE students take the following core (mandatory) subjects:

- English Language and Literature / English as a Second Language
- Mathematics (we offer core and extended level exams)
- Co-ordinated Sciences (a combined course covering Biology, Chemistry, and Physics)

# Optional exam subjects

In addition to the core subjects, students can choose to take exams in the following subjects.

These courses are offered in parallel, so students will select one option from each pair when starting Grade 9:

- Geography or History
- Business Studies or Psychology
- German or Spanish

## **Additional elective options**

We also offer creative and practical subjects that students can enjoy alongside their exam courses:

• Art & Design or ICT (Information and Communication Technology)

As a result, all students in Grade 9 and 10 study 9 subjects in total.

#### How are IGCSEs graded?

IGCSE results are awarded using one of two grading scales: **A (highest)\* to G (lowest)** for Mathematics and **9 (highest) to 1 (lowest)** for other subjects. A grade of C (or 4/5) and above is generally considered a good pass and an A/7 and above an outstanding result.
