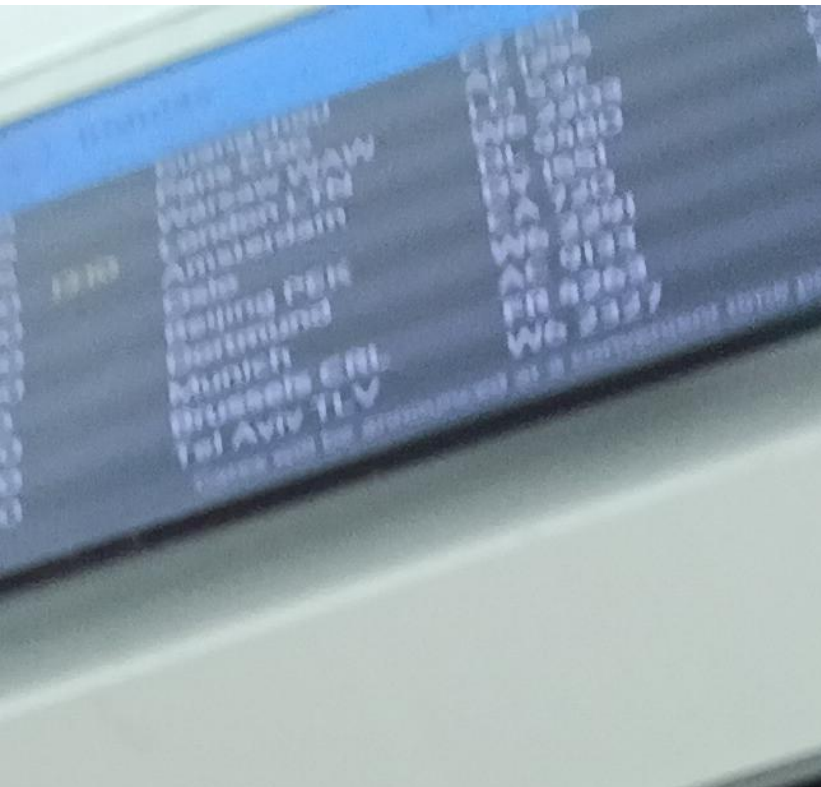

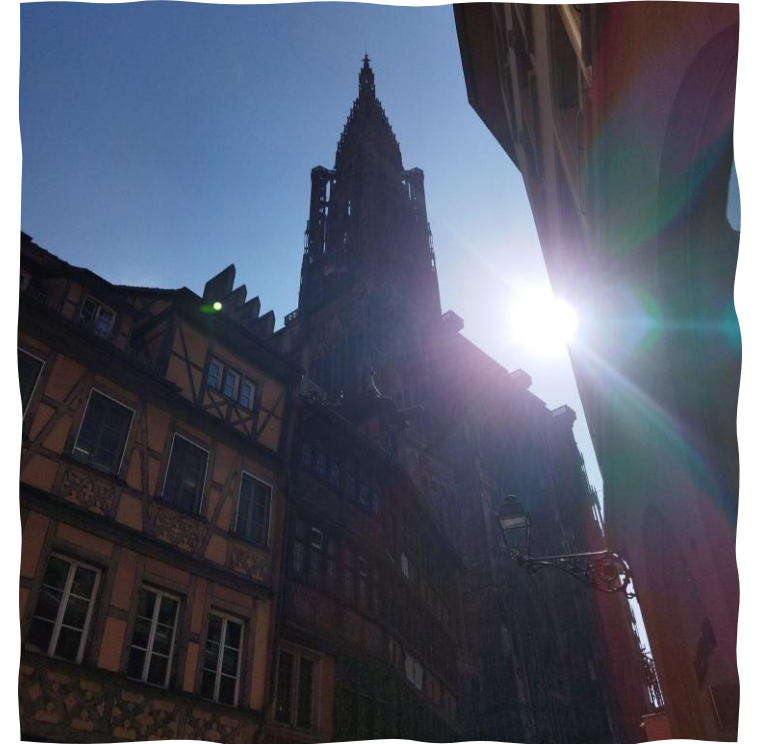

Day 2

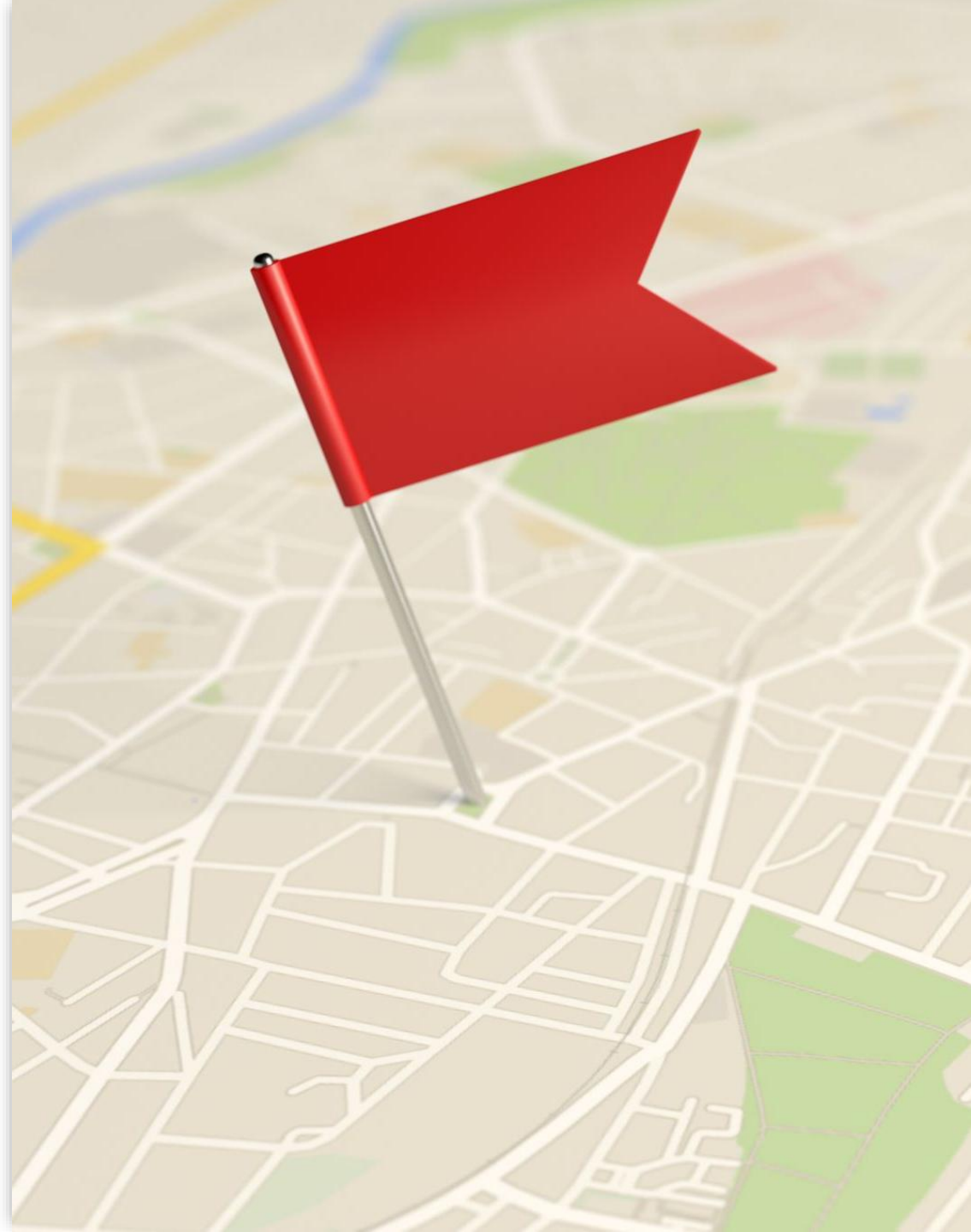
On day 2, we walked around Strasbourg's Old Town, visiting the main cathedral of the city, a garden and a planetarium.

- Strasbourg: has suitcase unfriendly sidewalks



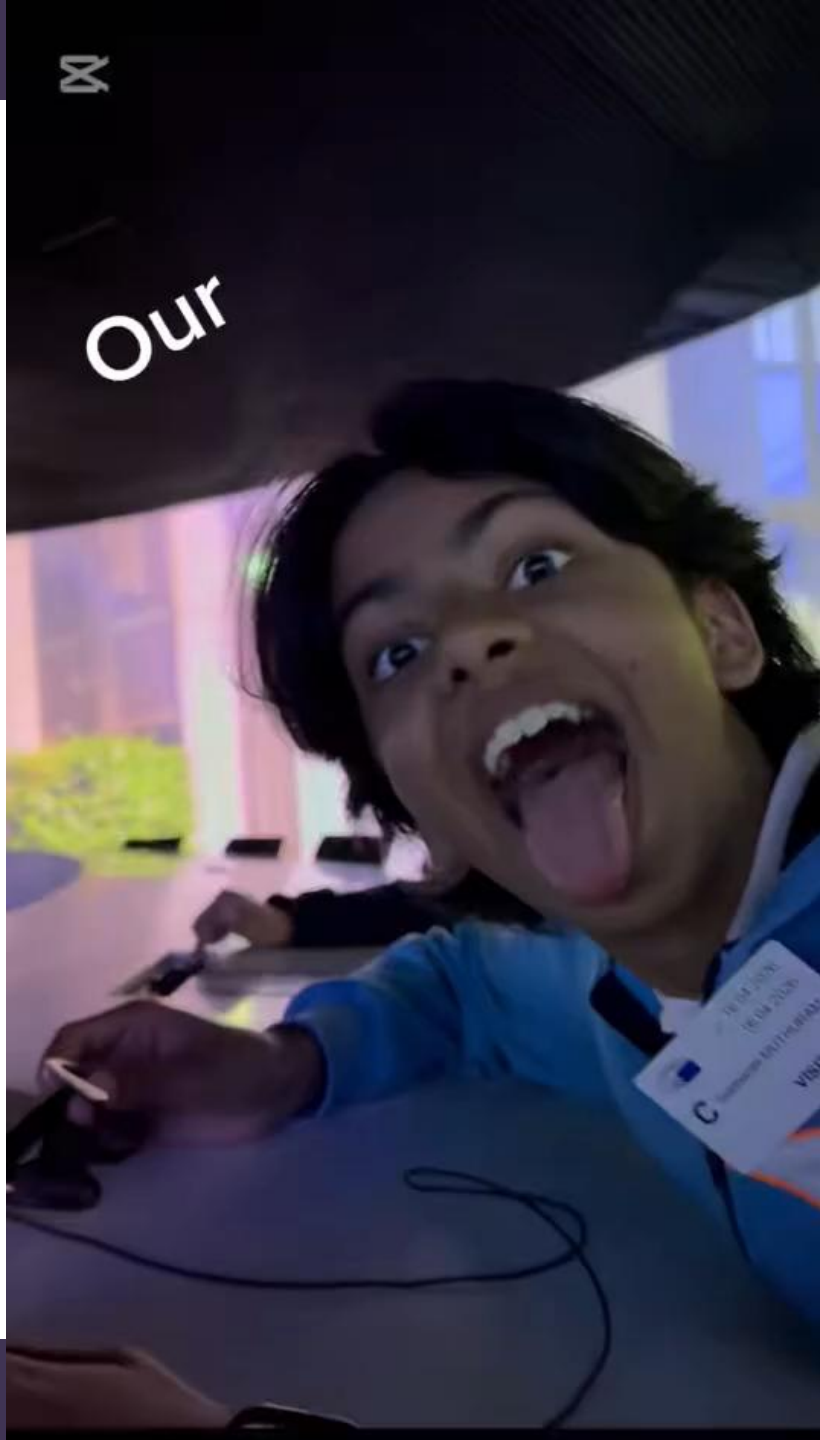
