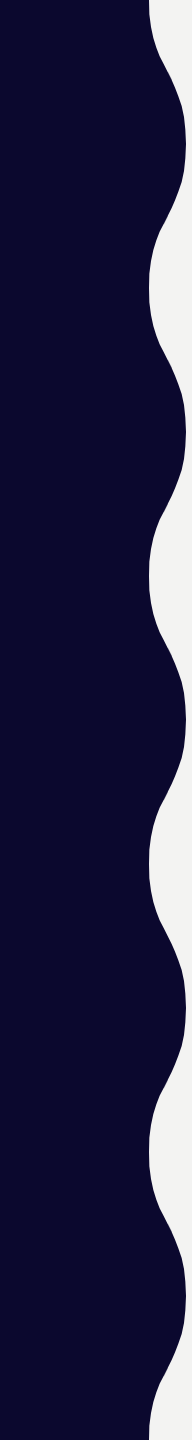

The Mask of Agamemnon, a gold funeral mask, dated 1550–1500 BC

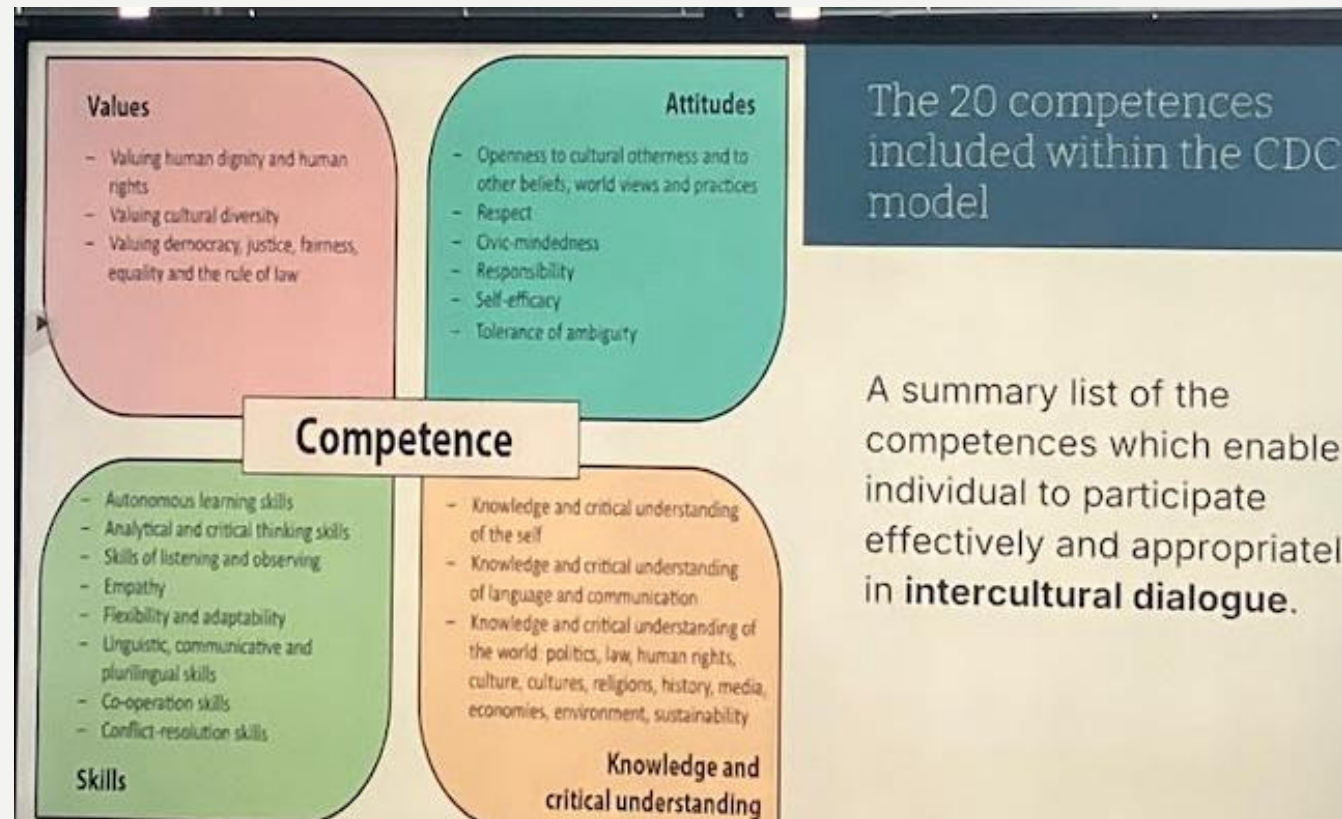
